atear (Oenanthe oenanthe). The most common mammals include the squirrel (Sciurus vulgaris), the roe deer (Capreolus capreolus) and the king of the scree surrounding the ponds of Siscaró, the marmot (Marmota marmota). These small animals live in family groups, a fact that helps us to see more than one of them at a time, especially when they come forth to eat and get some sun. The whistling sounds they make are very distinct.

One peculiar aspect of the lake is its reeds, which give the water a different tone of blue and the lake its name, Siscaró (the Catalan word sisca means "reed").
